September 10th, 2025**

The Udall City Council met for the City Council Meeting on Wednesday September 10th, 2025, at 6:30pm in the Udall City Hall Council Room. Matt **McAllister**, Mayor, called the meeting to order. Council members present were Dan **Rutschman**, Randy **Hoffman**, Jim **Caywood**, Craig **Hopkins** and David **Franz**. Quorum established. Also, present were Jennifer Mays, Erik King, Travis Hart, Justin and Patricia Caywood, Sarah Martin, Jack Wellman, Aaron Palmer and Jason Goza.

Meeting brought to order by McAllister at 6:30pm

Pledge of Allegiance

Invocation – Pastor Jack Wellman

Modification to Agenda – MOTION to approve the agenda as presented by **Hoffman**. **SECONDED by Caywood**. **McAllister** called for a vote. All Ayes. **MOTION Carried**.

Business from the floor –

1. Justin and Patricia Caywood – Requesting Road closures for the 5K run during Fall Fest. No vote required.
 2. Sarah Martin -
 - a. Requesting to put a bench in the park and help from the maintenance department.
 - b. The Methodist parking lot is need of crack seal – requested maintenance help and what labor rates and materials would cost. The council agreed to get her this information.
- Aaron Palmer – Discussion of the old flower shop on K15.

Maintenance – Needs more 10AWG wire from Border States for the trailer park.

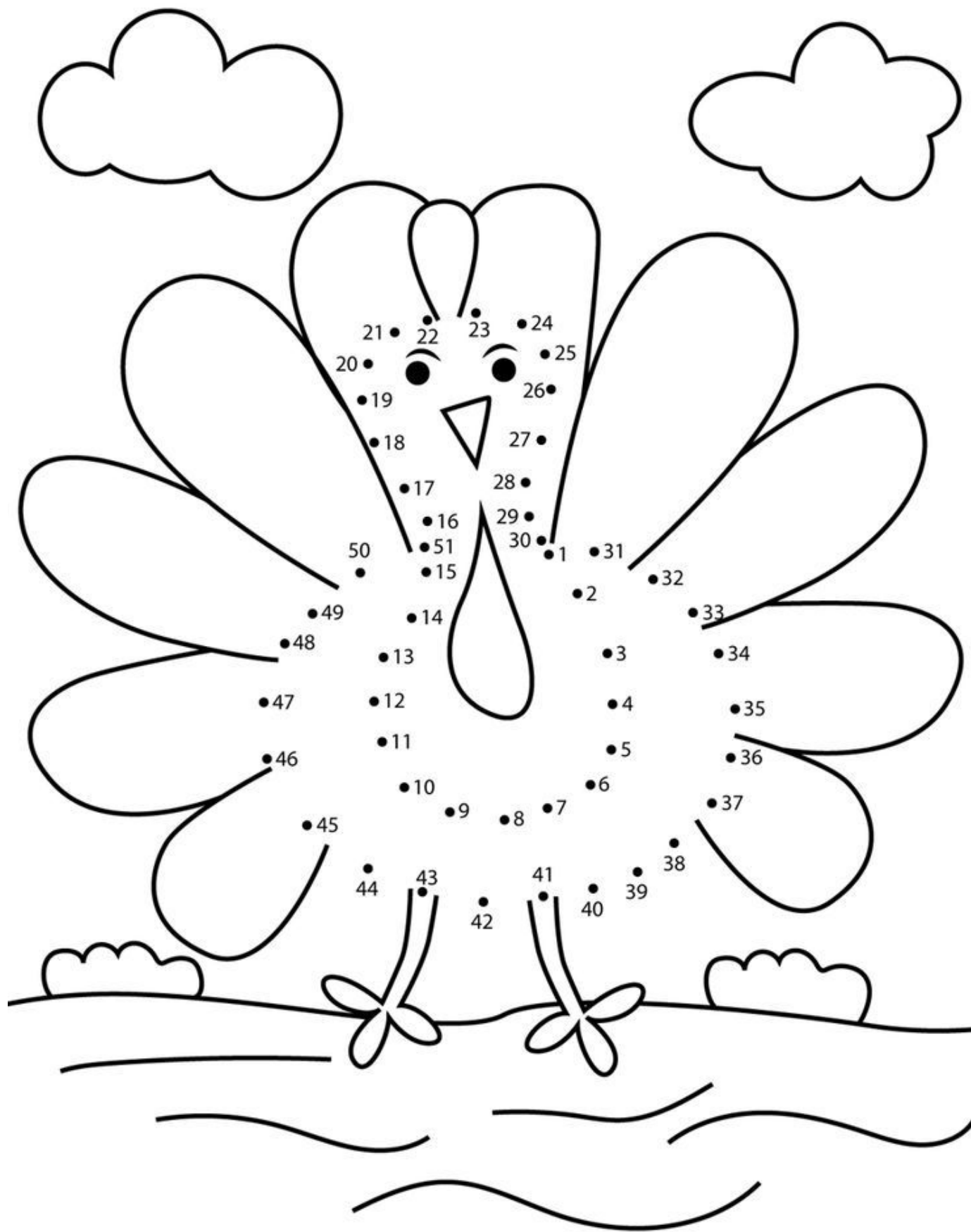
