In May in Kansas, you can plant warm-season vegetables like tomatoes, peppers, eggplant, sweet corn, cucumbers, and squash. You can also plant annual flowers for summer color, divide perennials, and mulch gardens. It's also a good time to sow seeds for beans, beets, summer squash, and other fast-growing vegetables. Here's a more detailed breakdown:

Plant Transplants:

Early May is ideal for transplanting tomato, pepper, and eggplant seedlings.

Direct Sow:


You can sow seeds directly into the ground for sweet corn, cucumbers, squash, beans, and other warm-season vegetables.

Other Good Choices:

Consider beans, beets, summer squash, peppers, tomatoes, lettuce, onions, radishes, and turnips.

Continue Harvesting:

Keep harvesting asparagus until the spear size decreases, and remove rhubarb seed stalks to encourage leaf growth.





The Udall City Council met for the City Council Meeting on Wednesday March 12th, 2025, at 6:30pm at the Udall City Hall Council Room. Matt McAllister, Mayor, called the meeting to order. Council members present were Dan Rutschman, Randy Hoffman, Jim Caywood, Craig Hopkins, and David Franz. Quorum established. Also, present were Jennifer Mays, Erik King, Dennis White and Jack Wellman.

Meeting brought to order by McAllister at 6:30pm.

Pledge of Allegiance

Invocation - Jack Wellman

Modification to Agenda - None.

MOTION by Hoffman to approve the agenda as presented. SECONDED by Caywood, McAllister called for a vote. All Ayes. MOTION Carried.

Business from the floor - None

CONSENT AGENDA – City clerk create a dashboard for January. **MOTION** by **Caywood** to accept the agenda as presented. SECONDED by **Hopkins. McAllister** called for a vote. All Ayes. **MOTION** Carried.

- 2. Historical Society Ron Beard MOTION to table by Hoffman. SECONDED by Caywood. McAllister called for a vote. All Ayes. MOTION Carried.
- 3. Stewart Addition Lot Sales No updates
- 4. Maintenance Lawn Mower After a lengthy discussion MOTION by Hoffman to purchase the Grasshopper 725DT 61" deck from Oxford Saw and Mower with a \$5500.00 trade is for our old mower, creating a purchase price of \$12,144.55. SECONDED by Hopkins. McAllister called for a vote. 3 AYES and 2 NAYS (Caywood and Franz). MOTION Carried.
- 5. Quoted from refuse companies Discussion no action taken at this time.
- 6. **ORD 587a** (Wheatstate Franchise Contract) **Hoffman** recused himself from voting. **MOTION** by **Franz** to approve Ordinance 587a. SECONDED by **Caywood**. **McAllister** called for a vote. All Ayes with one recusal. **MOTION** Carried.
- 7. ORD 702 Records Retention MOTION by Hoffman to approve Ordinance 702. SECONDED by Caywood. McAllister called for a vote. All Ayes. MOTION Carried.
- 8. ICI Insurance Renewal After a lengthy discussion MOTION by Caywood to approve the renewal as presented. SECONDED by Hopkins. McAllister called for a vote. All Ayes. MOTION Carried.
- 9. For next year can they raise some deductibles so we can raise Cyber and keep the billing the same? **Franz** wants to know if they can present us with several options every year.
- 10. **Retiree Policy in accordance with KSA12-5040** Discussion to decide on the percentage the employee will pay at 100% and decided the end dates for coverage were acceptable. Clerk left the meeting to make the edits and brought the copy to be voted on back to the meeting. **MOTION** by **Caywood** to approve the Retiree Policy. SECONDED by **Franz**. **McAllister** called for a vote. All Ayes. **MOTION** Carried.


