Fowl Permits Required in City Limits

Residents are reminded that fowl permits are required by City Code 2-124 "Anyone desiring a permit to keep animals must make application in writing and provide all the following information:

- a) The name and address of the applicant.
- b) The address and legal description of the property upon which the animals are to be kept.
- c) A plot plan, drawn to scale, of the applicant's property and all adjacent property within 100 feet, complete with all structures (existing and proposed), and indicating the area to be enclosed for the animals.
- d) Any other information bearing upon the maintenance control or keeping of the animals as the animal control officer or his designee may require.

These fowl permits are issued on an annual basis and are \$25.00

There are also limitations on the number of fowl; "domestic fowl permits allow a maximum of 10 chickens per residence, no roosters, guineas or peacocks."

City Park Playground and Splash Pad to Open.

In coordination with the Cowley County Health Department and in compliance with the State's guidelines, the Udall City Park playground equipment will be made available on June 1st. On June 8th the Splash Pad will be open for the summer. Regular hours are 9:00 am - 9:00 pm

The *Pathways to Health* walking path should be nearing completion soon and will provide approximately one-quarter mile of exercise. Please remember this is provided for walking or jogging; not for bikes or skateboards. The path was made available through a grant process with Blue Cross and Blue Shield and a significant contribution from the Udall S.U.N. Club. Members of the maintenance department were able to have much of the pipe required for the bridges donated. Several groups and individuals worked together to make this addition to the park a reality. In the near future, there may be opportunities to donate engraved park benches along the pathway.

OPEN COUNCIL POSITION

There is an open position on the Udall City Council due to the resignation of Jennifer Bonnell. The term would be until 2023.

REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING
CITY OF UDALL
Monday, April 13, 2020

The Udall City Council met for the Regular Council Meeting on Monday, April 13, 2020, at 6:30 p.m., at the Udall City Building. Stephen R. Brown, Mayor, called the meeting to order. Council members present were Janette Adams, Ethan Exley, Matt McAllister, and Carlton Smail. Quorum established. Also present were Eric Allen, Erik King and Lulita Hopkins.

MODIFICATION OF THE AGENDA:

MOTION: by Adams, second by Smail, to approve the agenda as presented. All voted aye. Motion carried.

GENERAL DISCUSSION:

1. The Blue Cross and Blue Shield Pathways to a Healthy Kansas grant proceeds were received of \$8,083.00. This was administered through the Cowley County Health Department and Cowley First. Proceeds will be used for the installation of a walking path in the city park.

CONSENT AGENDA:

MOTION: by Adams, second by Exley, to approve the consent agenda including the Regular Meeting minutes of March 9, 2020, Treasurer's and Clerk's reports for March, Expenditure Report in the amount of \$131,721.78 and Payroll Account Report of \$26,435.88. All voted aye, motion carried.

OLD BUSINESS:

1. Library/Wellness Center – The Environmental Review and the Environmental Assessment have been prepared and will be published as available for review by the public in the local paper. At the end of review period, the Request for Release of Funds will be presented to the Department of Commerce.
2. Resolution #332 – Financial assistance from USDA. This is the match funds for the Community Development Block Grant.

MOTION: by McAllister, second by Adams, to approve Resolution #332 authorizing request for financial assistance from the US Dept of Agriculture for matching funds. All voted aye, motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS:

1. Resolution 333 – waiving penalties on utilities for the months of March and April. This is something area cities are doing in conjunction with the State's Emergency Order Suspending Disconnects. Waiving of late fees eases the financial burden during this time.

MOTION: by Exley, second by Smail, to approve Resolution #333 waiving penalties on utility accounts during the months of March and April 2020. All voted aye, motion carried.

COUNCILMEMBERS REPORTS:

STAFF REPORTS:

Allen – The maintenance department has been trying out various backhoes. Their recommendation is a JCB from Kan Equip at \$66,600. Also, it is time to update one of the mowers and the favorable bid from Oxford Saw & Mower of \$8,906.56 was recommended.

MOTION: by McAllister, second by Smail, to authorize purchase of the JCB at \$66,600 with trade from Kan Equip. All voted aye, motion carried.

MOTION: by Exley, second by Adams, to approve the purchase of a 725DT Grasshopper mower from Oxford Saw & Mower at \$8,906.56. All voted aye, motion carried.

King – In consulting with the surveyor, there are some issues on the perimeter of the property on Clark. There are properties with fences that have no existing building permits or variances. These issues will need to be addressed before further development. Old Skool has approached the City regarding placing a small building on the arena property, there was a consensus this would not be beneficial. They (Old Skool) would also like to split the cost of announcing equipment.

MOTION: by Exley, second by Smail, to approve the funds up to \$800 for a sound system to be used at the Demo Derby Arena. All voted aye, motion carried.

Carrot Cake Baked Oatmeal Cups

Wet Ingredients:

- 1 C shredded carrots (2 medium)
- 2/3 C unsweetened applesauce
- 2 eggs, at room temperature
- 1 C unsweetened almond milk
- ¼ C pure maple syrup
- 1 Tbsp melted, cooled coconut oil

Dry Ingredients:

- 2 C Old Fashion Oats, (gluten free opt)
- 1 tsp baking powder
- 1 ½ tsp cinnamon
- ¼ tsp salt
- ½ C unsweetened shredded coconut
- ½ cup raisins
- 1/3 cup chopped pecans

Glaze:

- 2 Tbsp Cream cheese, softened
- 2 Tbsp powdered sugar
- ½ tsp vanilla extract
- 1-2 tps unsweetened almond milk

Preheat oven to 350°. Line a 12 cup muffin pan with muffin liners and spray with nonstick cooking spray to prevent oatmeal cups from sticking. In a medium bowl, mix together the shredded carrots, applesauce, eggs, almond milk, maple syrup and coconut oil until smooth and well combined. Next stir in dry ingredients; oats, baking powder, cinnamon and salt; stir well to combine. Fold in shredded coconut, chopped pecans and raisins. Evenly distribute oatmeal batter between muffin liners and bake for 25-30 minutes or until oatmeal cups are set.

To make the cream cheese glaze:

In a small bowl, mix together the cream cheese, powdered sugar, vanilla extract and almond milk. Drizzle or pipe over the oatmeal cups.

Makes 12 oatmeal cups.

(Should be stored in the fridge and will stay good for 4-5 days) Freeze for up to 3 months, microwave for 45 sec or until warm. No applesauce? 1 ripe banana!
